The Capital Sounds Concert Band provided the National Anthem. The AL National Guard Chaplain Major Anthony Holloway offered the Invocation at the beginning of the ceremony. The Carroll High School JROTC presented the Colors.

Mr. Seymour 'Sy' Lichtenfeld was the guest speaker and delivered an outstanding speech about his experience during WW II and how he was made a Prison Of War (POW) at the Battle of the Bulge. He related how his unit which was completely surrounded by a hugh German army for days. Surrendered only after they had fired their last bullets. Because of the German hatred towards Jews, Sy Lichtenfeld was in extreme danger of being killed at any time if they found out that he was Jewish. He discussed the harsh conditions that he and others had to endure during the coldest winter that German had. He and others had no shoes and often we were required to march in below zero weather and with snow on the ground.

During the ceremony, the number of POW/MIAs in each branch of our Services (Army (134), Marine Corps (14), Navy (11), and Air Force (24)) for the State of Alabama were reflected on posters. The State of Alabama has a total of 184 veterans that were POW/MIA victims



The Master of Ceremonies was Robert Horton who presented the Alabama Governor Robert Bentley's proclamation recognizing 22nd of September as the 2012 POW/MIA Recognition Day to Seymour Lictenfeld.

The Marine Corps League, P. L. Wilson of Detachment 447 conducted the Presentation and Raising of the POW/MIA flag on the State Capital flag pole.

Ms. Lela Brown sang The Battle Hymn of the Republic. The 151st Army Band provided the Taps at the closing of the ceremony.

The Vietnam Veterans Motorcycle Club reflected the significance of the "Missing Man Table" and identified all of the items on the Table.
